



Book Club in a Bag Discussion Questions

Violeta by Isabel Allende

- 1. What did you think about Violeta as a character? How did she evolve throughout the course of the book? Which period of her life was the most interesting to you? Did you learn anything from her story?
- 2. Violeta tells her story in the form of a letter, a practice inspired by Isabel Allende's own correspondence with her mother. What does this style add to the overall effect of the novel?
- 3. Allende chooses to leave the country unnamed in *Violeta*. Why do you think she made this choice? How did the open-ended setting impact your reading experience?
- 4. Discuss Violeta's various relationships. How does Allende capture the ways we love? In what ways does our capacity for love change over time?
- 5. Violeta says, "It was clear to me from a young age that although I respected them, my mother and my aunts were stuck in the past, uninterested in the outside world or anything that might challenge their beliefs." Discuss the ways different generations approach feminism.
- 6. *Violeta* is filled with playful, witty humor. What scenes or moments made you laugh? What does humor add to the overall effect of the story?
- 7. Violeta's Aunt Pia observes, "Better a boring husband that an unreliable one." Do you agree? Do you think passion or loyalty is more important for a good marriage?
- 8. Memory is major theme in this novel, made up of the unexpected events that make a life. Sometimes it's a blessing and sometimes it's a curse, as Violeta says. Discuss how the book explores memory.

Booking a Kit

- Booking may be made up to a year in advance.
- Please check the calendar accessible on our website for availability.

- Pick up your hold at the service desk. Your notification may come in a few days early, but it will remain available until your specified pick-up date.

Terms of Loan

- 12 copies are included in each kit.
- 6-week loan period.
- No renewals.
- Kit may be picked up at or returned to any CLMA library location.
- Kit must be returned at the service desk during operating hours, not through an exterior drop box.
- All items are checked out to one person's card.
- The person who borrowed the kit is responsible for:
 - The distribution and return of all items to their group members; and
 - Any damages to the books/bag, or lost items.
